Nick has been involved in the investigation and reconstruction of many types of traffic accidents involving cars, trucks, sport utility vehicles, commercial trucks, motorcycles, pedestrians, and bicycles. Nick has qualified to testify as an expert in traffic accident reconstruction.

Nick has an extensive range of specialized training in the areas of traffic accidents, digital forensics, and crime scene investigations. Nick is highly versatile in the collection and examination of digital evidence, including cellular phones, video surveillance, and computers. Additionally, Nick has over eight years of practical experience investigating crime scenes, including homicides, suicides, accidental deaths, aggravated assaults, robberies, burglary, and theft investigations, arsons, and numerous other investigations.

Nick is currently employed as a detective with the Gloucester County Prosecutor's Office, in Woodbury, New Jersey. Nick serves as a Traffic Collision Reconstructionist in the Crash Investigation Unit, and as an Investigator in the High-Tech Crimes Unit. Nick provides investigative assistance to various law enforcement agencies throughout Gloucester County. Nick's investigative activities involve the identification and investigation of causes and contributing factors of traffic-related crimes and traffic crashes; collection and interpretation of statistical data and physical evidence involving traffic collisions and arrests for traffic crimes and coordination of traffic safety-related activities throughout Gloucester County. Nick also served as a Crime Scene Investigator in the Crime Scene Investigation Unit from 2009 to 2017. His duties included providing crime scene investigative service, including photographic and video scene documentation; sketching and diagramming of crime scenes; visible and latent print examinations, comparisons, and identification utilizing physical and/or chemical development techniques; evidence detection, collection, and preservation; and courtroom presentations.

In 2015, Nick was assigned as the Chairperson for the Crash Investigation Training Committee at Kean University. Nick assisted in the research and development of an 80-hour basic crash investigation course for police officers, and an 80-hour advanced crash investigation course for police officers. Nick assisted other instructors in the revision of the program, as well as participated in a statewide research study of the effectiveness of the program.
